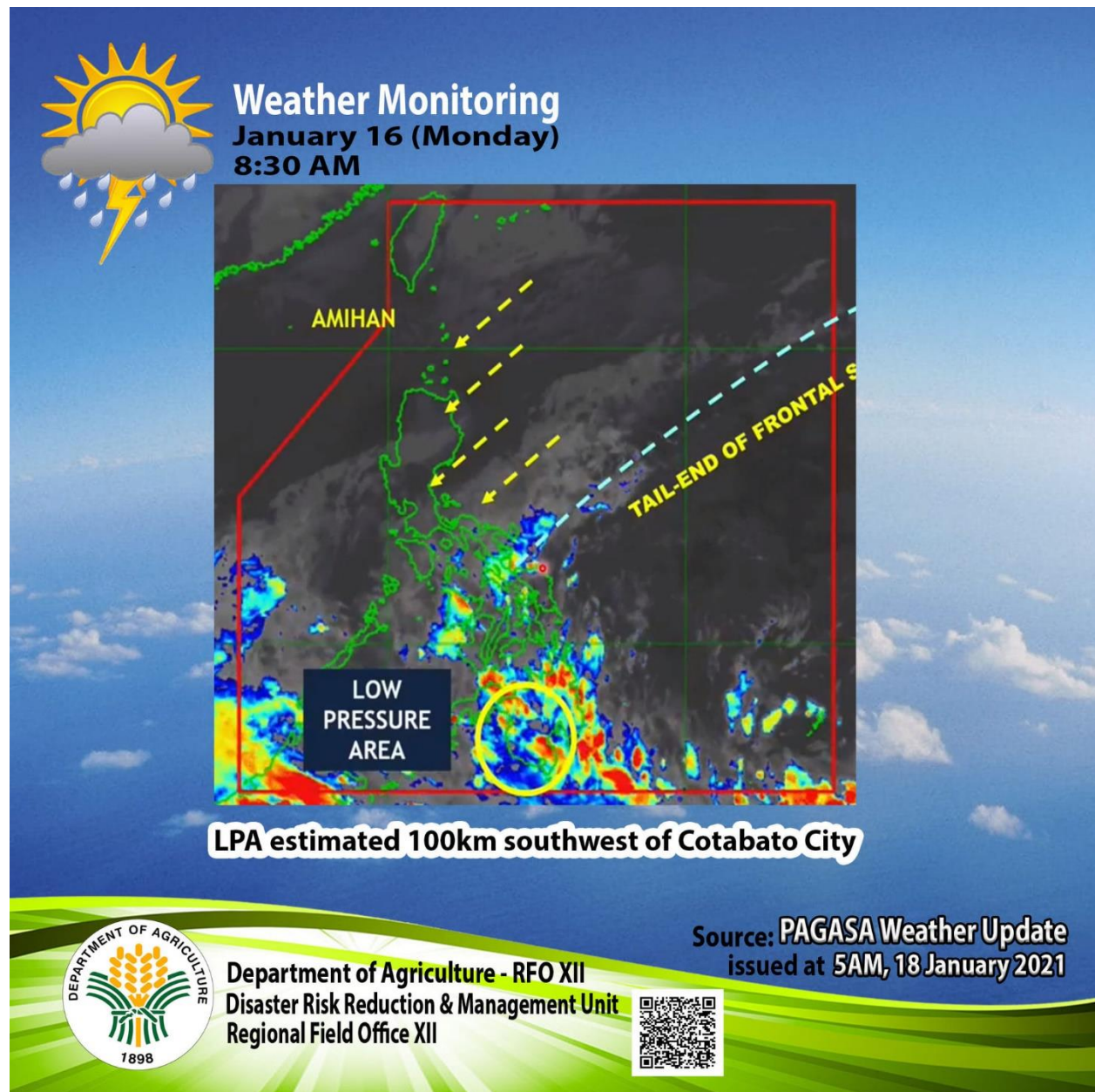


[#WeatherUpdate](#) | PAGASA Weather Forecast for 18 January 2021 (Monday, AM Forecast)

Sultan Kudarat - rivers and its tributaries particularly Tlan and Kraan.

South Cotabato - rivers and its tributaries particularly Siquil, Makar, and Banga.

Sarangani - rivers and its tributaries particularly Kalaong, Buayan-Malungon, Lun Padido, Lun Masla and Glan.

North Cotabato - rivers and its tributaries particularly Libungan, Malasila, Toliman Dunakling, Maridagao, Kabacan, Muleta, Arakan, Upper M'lang and Pulangi.
